Black Box Recovered from Crashed PANAM

DEN PASAR, BALI—The "black box" flight recorder of the Pan American jetliner that crashed on the mountainous terrain of Bali ten days ago has been found under the wing and wheels of the wreckage, a spokesman of an Indonesian rescue team said here Wednesday.

"The box is heavily weighed in by the wing and the wheels of the plane that would need special tools to pry it out from the underbrush of the ravine," Usodo said.

Usodo, while declining to say how soon the black box would be brought out of the tropical foliage, said the box would be given to the American team of the National Transportation Safety Board led by William Lamb who flew in here from the United States a week ago.

The box would be flown to Washington where it would be examined to determine the causes of the accident.

Aviation officials said it would at least take six months before they could come out with any theories on the accident.—AP/KNI.
